- To develop individual and ensemble skills within a percussion group.



So, the two package above are expansions on Lesson Plans that I created in the ACCESS Area. I am hoping that these packages will be available in late September, 2011.

The Aural 101 Workshop is based on the teaching technique developed by Kerri Lacey. The workshop is designed to give students a plan of how to answer the Music 1 questions in the HSC. How many times have you heard from your students: "Oh I new that" or "I didn't think that bit was relevant". This technique can help to clarify the confusion. It assumes that the students have sound musical knowledge and experience. It is not designed to teach them the elements of music, however, it is going to teach them how to manipulate their knowledge using:

- real time listening with a texture graph
- concise point form
- question keywords
- the who, what, when, where, why and how
- assumed knowledge
- style lists

These workshops are conducted by the author of this technique, Kerri Lacey. With over 20 years teaching experience, Kerri is able to help bridge the gap between listening and writing. These workshops are designed to be for smaller groups (max 40 students). Schools with smaller classes can invite other students from other schools or students from years 10, 11 and 12. The teacher must organise a day and time that best suits them for their personal workshop. The workshop options are:

- 1 hour workshop (\$80) best for students who have either experienced this workshop before, or students who have worked through the booklets.
- 2 hour workshop (\$160) best for students unfamiliar with this technique
- 2 hour workshop + Aural 101 series (\$200) this includes a two hour workshop, a copy of the Aural 101 books (3 in total) and the double CD pack (total value \$250)
